

Dear Highlawn,

The Church is not a corporation or a business that seeks to sell or cater to the tastes of others. The Church is not a club with guaranteed membership benefits or the trappings of social status. The Church is not a school where cliques and popularity contests determine success, or academic prowess is the ultimate goal. At its core, the Church is a relationship between fallen people who see Christ in each other and come together for mutual support, accountability, worship, and family.

The Sunday before this letter was written I was alarmed when I started reciting Ephesians 4:3 and there was no response. Granted, when I was in Bible Drill we used the KJV, but the truth is no different. Paul pens a commandment of God to the local churches that part of our mission is "Endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." To put it simply, "Remember that you are a family."

For too long we have allowed an un-Christ-like spirit of conformity to invade us. When present, we succumb to the temptation of thinking of someone who doesn't look like us, act like us, or talk like us, as being opposed to us. We strive for that person to conform and wind up looking at what they bring as flaws instead of potential. We hear phrases like "Unless you do _____ you're not really ____." Instead of something like "I've noticed you like to _____ have you ever thought of bringing your gifts to our _____ team?"

Part of the paradox of Church life is the way the Holy Spirit equips each of us differently. The challenges we face in our lives, the tastes we develop growing up, the skills and gifts we perfect through the years, even the traumas we sustain in a fallen world all contribute to ways that we can stand in service to



"If you do away with the yoke of oppression, with the pointing finger and malicious talk, and if you spend yourselves in behalf of the hungry and satisfy the needs of the oppressed, then



your light will rise in the darkness, and your night will become like the noonday. - Isaiah 58:9-10

"Will a mere mortal rob God? Yet you rob me. "But you ask, 'How are we robbing you?' "In tithes and offerings. You are under a curse —your whole nation—because you are robbing me. Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it. I will prevent pests from devouring your crops, and the vines in your fields will not drop their fruit before it is ripe," says the Lord Almighty. - Malachi 3:8-11

"Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Provide purses for yourselves that will not wear out, a treasure in heaven that will never fail, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." - Luke 12:32-34

In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.' - Acts 20:35

Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. - 2 Corinthians 9:6-8

APPLICATION:

Generously giving to God through the Church is well documented in scripture. It is found as early as the tithe of Abraham in Genesis 14 and stretches to the collection for the Jerusalem famine in 2 Corinthians 9. But this is not just an outflow of compassion. It is a Spiritual Discipline, a way of worshipping God through obedience.


The worship of God through the giving of tithes and offerings is not a business transaction between you and the church or its staff. Both "Tithing" (the prescribed Spiritual <u>obligation</u> of the first ten percent of income) and "Offering" (an <u>extra</u> amount determined individually for the purpose of expressing thanksgiving and fellowship with God) are both core practices of the Christian life. The

collection we take here at Highlawn goes toward the running of the Church, the giving of relief to St. Albans residence and Local Charities (Jericho House, Twin Cities Shelter, Jubilee Emergency Assistance Fund, Christ's Kitchen, etc...), the Missionary and Disaster Relief efforts of the West Virginia Baptist Convention, as well as Educational and Fellowship Opportunities for our members.

The scriptures remind us, we "do not own ourselves" nor do not own our property. A Christian in obedience and a right relationship with God is centered on Kingdom thinking. Paul reminds us in 1 Cor. 6:19-20 that we are "bought with a price." We are a fallen person, now redeemed, who heeds to the understanding that they are stewards and not owners of their earthly possessions. (Psalm 24:1)

Our Spiritual obligation is in being a servant who learns the art of joyfully relinquishing the first-fruits of their labors and not that which was left over. Part of the wisdom of setting aside the tithe before the rest of our budget is that it tends to help everything else fall into place. This practice also shows faith in God's provision as well as the primacy that we should give to Him as the ultimate focus of a Christian Life.

A monetary tithe is also just one component of this practice. As a Church, the disciple of "giving" also means living up to our covenant by supporting the ministry of the local body of believers by dedicating our time, efforts, resources, and Spiritual gifts to the work of the Kingdom. Participation in ministry is another act of willing obedience in offering mercy and compassion to those we are called to serve. A tithe of time in service as a teacher, as a hospitality provider, as a worshipper, as a trustee, as a deacon, as a visitation worker, as a pastor, as a choir member; all these are examples of a grateful brother or sister in Christ who gives freely of themselves in praise and adoration and thanksgiving:

We shall promote the prosperity and spirituality of this Church and sustain its worship, ordinances, discipline, and doctrines. We shall contribute cheerfully and regularly to the support of the ministry and expenses of this Church, the relief of the poor, and the spread of the Gospel through all nations. - Covenant of Highlawn Baptist Church.

The motivation behind such generosity should also be guarded. Simply stated we give because we are convicted by the difference God has made in our lives and earnestly desire for Him to make a difference in the lives of others as well.

If you love God, you show that love through obedience. God is the primary focus of a Christian Life and accepts no substitutions for His rightful place. All other concerns, no matter how pressing they may seem, fall into place after we put Him in the preeminent position that He alone deserves. Notice the challenge Malachi brings to us from the voice of God: "Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it." (Malachi 3:10).

God knows the condition of our lives and the pressures we feel in meeting our earthly obligations. He also requires us to be faithful in our obligations to Him. This is the only place in scripture (that I know of) where God asks us to "test" Him. Please do not understand this statement to say that your giving will be a "magic formula" that will bring you riches and fortune. But what we can take from this passage is that God is faithful in meeting the needs of His children and is trustworthy in rewarding them for their obedience.
